


LGBT+ History & Healthcare

1967 – England decriminalised homosexuality between two men

1980's – First cases of Gay-Related Immune Deficiency are recorded **2004** – Gender Recognition Actenabling transgender people to obtain a Gender Recognition Certificate.

2010 – The Equality Act provides protection against discrimination



1980 – Aversion therapy stopped being offered as a cure for on the NHS for homosexuality

1992 – The WHO no longer lists homosexuality as a mental illness

2007 – Department of Health produces first LGBT briefings, demonstrating commitment to addressing the needs of LGBT people

2018 – The WHO no longer lists trans identities as a mental illness



- Clinical service provision: Including Perinatal, Fertility, Oncology, Laboratory, Sexual Health & Gynaecology
- Workforce inclusion
- Leadership
- Sexual Orientation, Gender and Trans Status monitoring
- Facilities
- Engagement



Assessment process

Policy reviews

Patient and staff surveys

Clinical Services survey

Workforce assessment



Outcomes

- Graded assessment which results in either a certificate of commitment or a bronze, silver, gold award.
- Detailed report into findings that also provides the trust with a clear action plan to create meaningful change.
- Demonstrates meeting legal requirements to reduce health inequalities for a group with a protected characteristic.
- Access to expert support, best practice guidance and network forums.
